Prof. Hasegawa is a true pioneer who has opened the eyes of the Japanese to behavioral ecology and evolutional study of human behavior and psychology. She started her research with animal behavior and her recent research topics are:

Homicide by men in Japan: the relationship between age, resource and risk-taking: Life history and reproductive strategies in humans and chimpanzees: Sexual selection and mate choice among the blue peacock.

Recently Japanese National TV has aired her lectures on sex and sexuality.

The Speaker for the Special Session open to the public is:

Masahiro Morioka, Professor of Philosophy and Ethics at Osaka Prefecture University, Japan and Director of Research Institute for Contemporary Philosophy of Life. He is a leading researcher on male sexuality in Japan.

In 2005, he introduced Japan to a brand new perspective on male sexuality with his book titled "The Insensitive Man, A philosophical essay on male sexuality". He is the first male researcher who openly discussed men's sexual insensitivity and their rejection of their own bodies. Next, he published a book titled "Lessons in Love for Herbivore Boys" (2008). This is a how-to book on love for gentle, inexperienced young men. The term "herbivore boys (men)" became very popular in the Japanese mass media and was reported worldwide. This book also serves as a practical
